ELIMINATE & CONTROL Remove or cover standing water in yards Use screens on doors & windows ACPH is set to resume mosquito surveillance this summer. Mosquito traps will be placed throughout the county. Residents are encouraged to report large populations of mosquitoes and locations where mosquito breeding is likely to be taking place such as standing water. Based on citizen reports, mosquito traps will be located in secure areas and mosquitoes will be collected for testing and identification as part of Ohio's response to the Zika virus outbreak.

While mosquitoes are not tested for Zika virus, we do monitor the types of mosquitoes to help determine if the mosquitoes that potentially transmit Zika virus are present in our area.

The Ohio Department of Health does test mosquitoes for West Nile Virus as a way to help prevent the spread of disease. Monitoring local mosquitoes for infection allows us to share timely messages with the community so people take precautions against getting bit. We monitor reports of mosquito borne diseases among humans. Generally, conditions associated with increasing human risk—increases in mosquitoes—can be detected 2-4 weeks before human cases start being reported.

Zika virus disease is transmitted by mosquitoes. There is no indication ZIKA can spread personto-person through casual contact. However, the CDC has reported several cases of Zika virus infection in non-travelers in the continental United States after their sexual partners returned from an affected area and developed symptoms. 80% of people infected with Zika virus do not have any symptoms. If they do have symptoms, they are usually mild. Fever, rash, joint pain, red eye, muscle pain and headache are reported. Hospitalization is not common with Zika virus. Despite these mild symptoms, health officials have determined that there is a link between Zika virus infections in pregnant women and birth defects. Steps should be taken to reduce the chance of getting bitten by a mosquito, and to eliminate mosquito populations around your home.

Along with providing health services at Allen County Public Health and WIC, the ACPH mission of protecting and promoting public health was also demonstrated by engaging the community through public presentations (9), and news media appearances in print (3), radio (6) and TV (4) during the month of June.
