# "OHIO'S DROP-OFF LAW"

Not all women who get pregnant are ready to raise a child. Ohio's "Drop -Off Law" allows a birth parent to leave an unharmed newborn infant (less than 30 days old) with:

- medical worker at a hospital
- A medical worker at a fire station or other emergency service

organization

• A peace officer at a law enforcement agency (i.e. police)

If the infant is left with a person at one of these places, and has not been abused, the parent will not get in legal trouble for making this choice. The birth parent does not have to give any information, including his or her name.
